Are your students experts on life in the jungle? Can they keep a whole jungle ecosystem alive? "This game allows

players to see how the different species of plants and animals in a rainforest depend on one another, and to experiment with how changing the amount of one resource affects the whole ecosystem.

Their goal is to put together a balanced ecosystem, in which each animal



has enough food to survive over a period of 12 days. The longer their ecosystem lasts, the more points they will earn for their sticker collections." This makes a great whole class activity when used on the SMART Board.

change them from one form to another in this fun, interactive science activity. Water is a common example as it exists in all three forms, you've no doubt seen it as ice, liquid water and steam. Challenge yourself to find the correct category for other examples such as milk, sand, rain, helium, wood, and air. Watch what happens when you heat liquids and cool gases. The processes that change solids, liquids and gases from one form to another are important science topics, humans breathe in gases in the form of air and drink liquids such as water which help keep us alive. Educational and entertaining, this game offers a fun

challenge for kids." This site works great on the SMARTboard.






MOLLY'S MORE OR LESS QUEST Math K.2 & 1.2b

If the wrong answer is chosen, the student may try again. Can your students help Molly get to the party quickly?

sight word games for kindergarten that offers plenty of exposure to several word lists (such as Dolch and Fry). Listen to the word to know what you are supposed to find, then smash it. Strike the broken block a second time to remove it. Try not to hurt your hand." To start the game, choose between the kindergarten, first or second-grade word lists. The second item to choose is whether to use a mouse or touch screen when playing the game. It also works well on a SMARTboard.
